

IMPORTANT INFORMATION TO SHARE WITH APPLICANTS

- All applicants must meet the following requirements:
 - Must be at least **16 years of age (but not older than 17)** at the time of appointment, and a high school junior
 - Have a valid social security card
 - Must be fluent in written and spoken English
 - Have a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher in their core academic courses (math, English, science, social studies and foreign language)
- **Parents/Guardians are responsible for the Page's transportation expenses to/from Washington, DC, and Page Residence Hall (PRH). If Pages plan to arrive the day before orientation, he or she will not be able to stay in the dorm and must make accommodation arrangements. Please note, most area hotels will not allow someone under 18 years of age to check in unaccompanied by an adult.**
- Upon acceptance into the House Page Program, applicants will receive an appointment packet from the Clerk's Office with detailed transitional information for the Page on-boarding process.
- All House Pages are required to wear and purchase the official Page uniform. Ordering instructions will be provided in the appointment packet. An official Page tie is issued to them at the start of the session.
- Pages must have proper identification to include a current passport, driver's permit or school I.D., and a Social Security card. If they do not have a social security card, they must apply for one and submit a letter of verification from the Social Security Administration until the card is received.
- Pages must have health care insurance with transferrable benefits to the Washington, DC, area prior to arrival.
- Pages must receive a full and complete physical including updated immunization(s) prior to arrival.
- Pages are required to have a checking or savings account designated to receive their payroll funds prior to arrival.
- Pages must pay a \$100.00 non-refundable administrative fee prior to arrival.
- Pages must give up all home, school and community activities through the appointment period.
- Although Page Program sessions run contiguously, a Page can only participate in one session at a time.

COMPENSATION

Pages are currently paid a monthly gross salary of \$1,761.91 from which automatic deductions are made for federal and state taxes, Social Security, and the monthly 35% Page Activity Fee (approximately \$616.00), which covers housing expenses, a meal plan, and programming activities.
