Dear Chairmen Bowles and Simpson:

We write to request that the process that will govern the work of the National Commission on Fiscal Responsibility and Reform is fully transparent and highly inclusive, in keeping with the pledge of openness made by the Administration.

The recommendations that you and your colleagues on the Commission will craft this year will impact every single American. This body will make suggestions about how our country allocates its resources – whether and how to invest in health care, our social safety net, education, clean energy, tax benefits for some, costly weapons systems, and our two overseas wars. With the stakes this high, it is important that the American people understand the work of the Commission as it puts forward a plan that, if enacted into law, will change each of their lives.

In order to facilitate the openness and transparency needed for the Commission to engage and inform the public, we recommend that as your work proceeds, the Commission:

- Release a clear analysis, as a part of its recommendations, of how any proposed cuts and tax increases will affect various demographic groups, showing how large these potential cuts and tax increases will be as a share of projected income;
- Provide information revealing how investments, made or not made – in job creation, infrastructure, child development, education, support for persons with functional disabilities, alternative energy, etc. – are likely to affect the well-being of today’s children as they age, tomorrow’s children, and the entire economy generally;
- Consult experts representing a wide range of views, not just on the deficit and fiscal policy, but also with specialized expertise on the particular programs under consideration;
- Hear from representatives of those affected by potential recommendations;
- Permit C-Span coverage and internet streaming of all your meetings and deliberations, including planning meetings, working meetings, drafting sessions, public meetings, and all other sessions where commission work is performed or planned;
- Issue an interim report or a set of draft recommendations before Election Day 2010, so as to allow the Commission’s work to be a part of various federal, state, and local campaigns around the country.

We would appreciate the opportunity to work with you to ensure that these necessary transparency measures are in place prior to the start of the Commission’s work.
